Dear Christ UMC Family,

The season of Easter—sometimes called "Eastertide"—is dedicated to celebrating the resurrection of Jesus that changed the world. Did you know that Easter is a season of fifty days? Like Advent and Lent, Easter spans multiple Sundays, culminating in the celebration of Pentecost Sunday. That's why we call it "Pentecost," because Pentecost means "The Fiftieth."

We don't just have one Sunday per year to exclaim "Christ is risen," we have an entire season of fifty days to do so. As a pastor, I always like to take advantage of this Easter Season to offer a worship series that reflects on the themes of resurrection and how resurrection life shows up in our everyday spheres.

Beaches Boys and Girls Club

eaches Boys and Girls Club, a non-profit organization located on Seagate Avenue, in Neptune Beach is strategically planted between Fletcher Middle School, Fletcher High School and San Pablo Elementary. This Club serves at-risk school children from our beach communities with after-school programs, summer camp opportunities and much more. Because of the generosity of those attending our Easter sunrise service, we are happy to support not only the Beaches Boys and Girls Club, but two other local ministries as well. Thanks be to God for His provision.

Club Demographics for the 2020 - 2021 school year:

- 96% of our members are on free or reduced lunch.
- 90% of our members are from households with annual incomes under \$28,000.
- Only 27% of our members live with both parents, with 60% living with a single mother.

Door Locking Procedures at CUMC

oor locking is a frequent topic but here is a little twist. A member of the Security Task Team makes certain all doors to the Sanctuary are locked (but still propped open manned by an Usher) before the service begins. Fifteen minutes into the service this person double checks to be certain all doors have been closed and fully latched.

The door on the side of the Sanctuary is one of the doors that is double checked. Good intentioned members sitting close to that door hear the click of the door as it's being checked and open it on occasion. The good intentions of members close to that door put everyone at risk if they open it.

Suppose for just a moment there is someone with ill intent on their minds. They try doors and if locked seek another way of entry. A door suddenly opening gives that person easy access to the congregation. This has happened often enough to be brought to the attention of all.

A good rule of thumb, once the Worship Service begins, become immersed in it and leave the doors to those who are trained in our Security Protocols.

As a reminder: Do not open doors anytime after the service begins (except by Ushers). Stay Alert and Stay Alive.
