## **Methodist Seminary of Cuba**

ur Mission: "...for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ." Eph. 4:12

The goal of the Cuba Methodist Seminary Fund is to support the work of the Methodist Church in Cuba through training Pastors effectively for ministry.

There are currently 119 students at the Havana Seminary. It takes six years of study to graduate from the Seminary (two years in the district extensions and four years in the Havana Seminary), completing 164 credit hours. The Seminarian is both a pastor and a student during this time.

There are 34 district theological seminaries throughout the Island (each Methodist district has one seminary, with some having more than one). There are 1,700 students and 324 professors in the extensions.

#### MAKING A QUICK EXIT

### **Security Corner**

de just completed a quick vacation that required us to take a round trip flight. The flight attendant did the normal safety announcement about buckling your seatbelt, placing your oxygen mask on before helping others AND locating your nearest emergency exit, which may be behind you.

What does this have to do with security at CUMC? EXITS, EXITS, EXITS. Did you know the Sanctuary has 7 exits which can be used in an emergency evacuation? Most of us know the 4 main Sanctuary doors

to use as exits in an emergency. Some of us know there are double doors marked "EXIT" at the front left of the Sanctuary. Few know there are even 5 *more* exits!

There are 2 doors on either side of the Chancel (Pulpit, Organists, Pianist, and Choir). These doors would be the quickest way for people in that area to exit. There is another exit door to the right front of the Sanctuary which is marked "EXIT."

The other two exits are not so obvious. The Parlor door which

leads to the office area provides an exit and there is an exit door in the Narthex (Lobby of CUMC) to the left as you exit which goes to the parking lot. Seven exits in total.

The next time you are in the Sanctuary look for the main and NOT so main exits so you can get out in the case of an evacuation. Remember, your best exit may be behind you.
