Security Corner

/iolence against two Christian churches highlights this month's Security Corner. One in a church near Sydney, Australia, and one here in the United States.

A 16-year-old boy attacked six people in a church outside of Sydney with a knife on Sunday. April 15th and one of those stabbed was a Priest standing at the lectern. Thankfully, no deaths occurred and the attacker was apprehended. Police have labeled this as a religious terrorist attack.

In Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, a small American city with a population of 57,000, an 18-year-old Isis terrorist "want-to-be" planned to attack multiple Christian churches on Sunday, April 15th. He was

going to use knives, a machete, guns, and fire to kill as many Christians as possible before being killed by police. He was arrested on Saturday, April 14th, with all the items he was planning to use the next day. This young man had boasted about his upcoming attacks on a social media site that was monitored by the authorities.

The point here is that there are people in this world hunting for Christians regardless of the size of the community. We at Christ UMC must remain vigilant and on watch for anything or anyone CUMC Security Task Team that is out of place.

Your Security Team does its best to come up with policies and actions to help keep us a least likely target. All doors are kept locked at ALL times. People coming to our campus are screened before they are given access including those coming to our sanctuary services. The Preschool has the same strict standards.

It truly is a shame that we live in a world where the innocent need such vigilance against violence. The size of the city or church seems to not matter to those with evil on their minds.
