Christians who claimed membership in a church has decreased from 70% to 45% since 2000. There are multiple reasons for this but all seem to be rooted in wounds committed by the church or feelings that the church does not reflect Jesus. In other words, the church has lost its relevance, like a piece of old furniture that is falling apart. However, I don't think all hope is lost. It's just time for a renovation.

ur Mission Highlight this month for May is the Methodist Church of Cuba. Our mission is..."for the equipping of saints, for the work of service, to the building of the body of Christ ." Eph. 4:12

The Methodist Church in Cuba is:

- Transforming people's lives in Cuba with the Gospel of Jesus Christ
- Growing at around 10% each year and has been for 20+ years
- One of the largest and fastest growing denominations in Cuba with now over 450 churches

God is doing an amazing work on the island of Cuba through the Methodist Church in Cuba that you will never see on the news. Those who have seen it with their own eyes know how astounding

this is and the joy we receive from being a part of it. Donation dollars go a long way in Cuba. For example:

A \$20 donation will provide salary supplement for a month for one pastor.

- A \$50 donation will support the Fund for Cuba retired pastors.
- A \$150 donation will cover expenses for a pastor to attend Seminary for a full year.
- A \$250 donation will support the Methodist House for the Elderly.
- A \$500 donation will help purchase a House Church for a new church planting.


